

Welcome!

The 2016 Grassland Society Conference has been designed to provide quality information to producers on the important pillars of grassland agriculture - soils, pasture systems, economics θ risk management and new technologies. The committee has put a strong focus on not only providing quality speakers but also delivering information that producers can utilise to make a difference to their farm business.

Opening the conference is Dr Doug Edmeades from New Zealand, who will present on separating fact from fiction in regards to soils and our management of soils. The session will also address phosphorus curve, nitrogen usage and strategies for managing wet areas.

The pasture systems segment will focus on the cost of pasture production and efficient pasture utilisation. Phil White, a local consultant, will do a joint presentation with Tania Luckin (2016 Dairy Australia Business Managers of the Year) on understanding the cost of pasture, providing examples of how Tania and her husband Stephen have changed their pasture production system to improve the profit of their dairy business at Mt Clay, Heywood. Laurie Close from Apsley will provide us with a producer's perspective on changing farming practices to better utilise and grow grass.

In the afternoon we will tour Jigsaw Farms north of Hamilton, where Mark Wootton and his team will give an insight into the business and the changes they have made to assist in risk management, including pasture production, grazing systems and agroforestry. We will also visit the Agriculture Victoria Research Station south of Hamilton (Former PVI) where we will visit multiple research

sites/projects that include Lucerne for Lamb, the automated feed intake facility - where sheep are fed a range of different forages and the methane levels and feed effiencies are recorded - as well as new technologies in pasture breeding.

The evening dinner will feature the best of Western Victoria's local wines and food, and guest speaker Rob McGavin (Boundary Bend Olives, Cobram Estate and Poligolet, Derrinallum) will provided us with an insight into his diverse business interests and the opportunities he sees for agriculture going forward.

Following breakfast on day two the Mac Troup Oration will be delivered by Tom Silcock (Mountain Dam Merinos) a local woolgrower and industry leader who will provide us with an insight into challenges and opportunities we might face in the future.

Dr Richard Eckard will address climate adoption and mitigation, and Cam Nicholson will speak on strategies and opportunities to combat a variable climate. Johnathon Tocker will also present his PhD on Southwest Farm Economics.

The final segment will focus on new technologies where Dr Dave Lamb, Hannah Marriot and Elizabeth Morse-McNab will provide us with an understanding of tools such as Satellite Moisture Mapping, EID and Virtual Fencing to improve our farm management systems and make our businesses more efficient and profitable long term.

We look forward to seeing you in Hamilton!
